



Why participate in collaboration projects?

- Access to new knowledge, skills, methods, data, facilities and technologies
- Strategic partnerships and collaborations
- Development of cutting-edge ideas and solutions to address Global challenges
- Opportunities for multidisciplinary and interdisciplinary research and cross-sector collaborations
- Projects often fund researchers, research assistants, laboratory assistants etc. and give them international merit and experience.
- It is fun and exciting!



Minimum consortium size

- Collaborative projects (incl. RIAs, IAs): Usually a consortium must have a minimum of 3 independent legal entities, each established in different EU Member States (MS) or Associated Countries (AC), with at least 1 of them established in a MS
- Coordination & Support Actions: One or more legal entities, which may be established in a MS, AC, or in exceptional cases and if provided for in the specific call conditions, in another third country.



Security & Social Sciences and Humanities (SSH)

".... this topic requires the effective contribution of Social Science and Humanities (SSH) disciplines and the involvement of SSH experts, institutions as well as the inclusion of relevant SSH expertise, in order to produce meaningful and significant effects enhancing the societal impact of the related research activities."

"..... full involvement of citizens and civil society organisations is crucial to achieve solutions that meet the requirement of having a balanced approach between security and openness of public spaces."

"Social innovation is recommended when the solution is at the socio-technical interface and requires social change, new social practices, social ownership or market uptake."



End-user and Practitioner involvement

"This topic requires the active involvement of at least 2 Police Authorities and at least 2 First Responder organisations... For these participants, applicants must fill in the table "Eligibility information about practitioners"

"End-users should be involved in all steps of the cycle from design to development and testing."

This topic requires the active involvement of at least 3 organisations representing citizens or local communities, practitioners (first and/or second responders), and local or regional authorities and private sector

"Cooperate with the Networks of Practitioners projects funded under H2020"



What is Practitioners?

"Someone who is qualified or registered to practice a particular occupation, profession in the field of security or civil protection."

(Work programme)
