- Everyone is obliged to follow fundamental ethical principles such as Helsiniki declaration of human rights and animal rights
- Mistakes in this area can have serious consequences on the wellbeing of others and on your and your host's careers

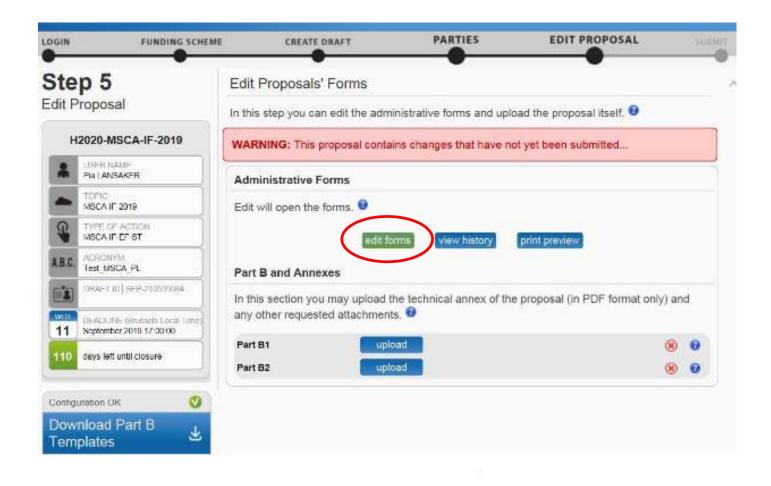
